

MCA gives hope to job seekers

KUALA LUMPUR: Following the success of the Higher Opportunities for Private Education (HOPE) programme in 2007, the MCA will collaborate in the TRAIN programme.

While HOPE coordinated the placement of students who were unable to enter local public universities, TRAIN promotes vocational training programmes for dropouts who are not academically inclined.
